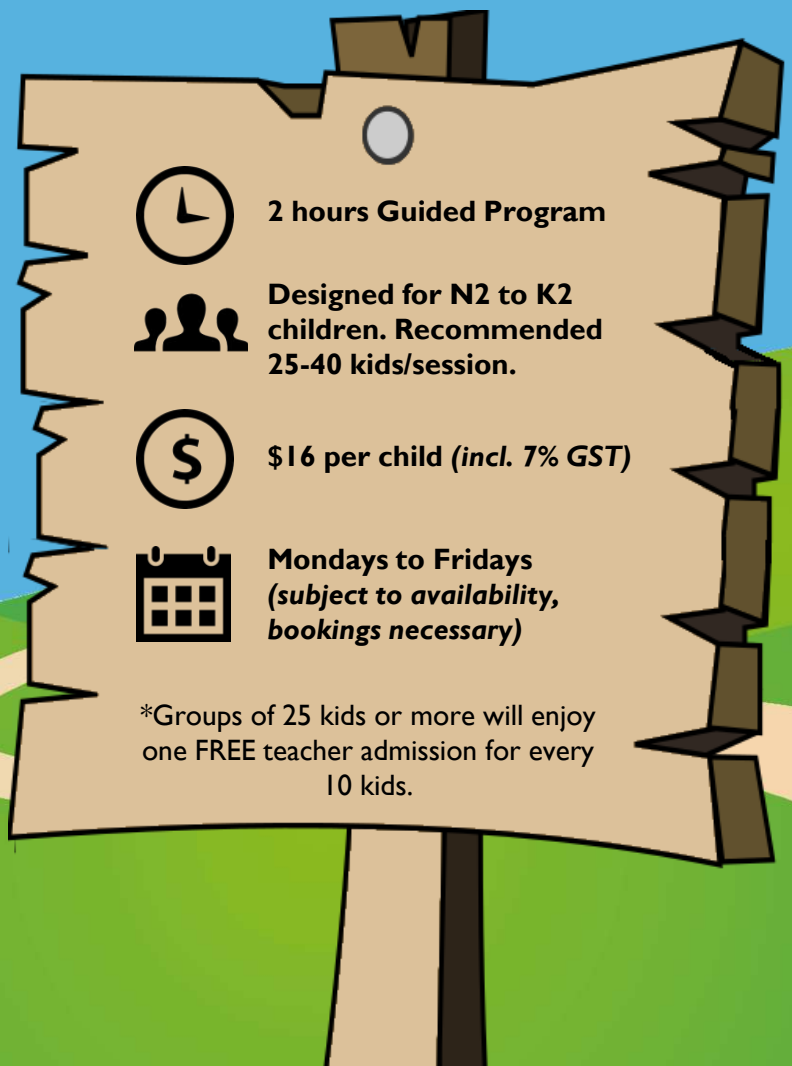


PART 2 - PRESCHOOL LEVEL FIELD TRIP

This 2-hour guided program continues the learning journey to **enhance** and **reinforce** learning of the eye & vision from **Part 1 of the Series** and the **influence** from **environmental factors** and **visual habits**. It comes with a **basic vision** and **visual skills assessment** for the student participants.

This program is designed for Nursery 2, Kindergarten 1 & 2 children who **have participated in Part 1 of the Series** and **for those who have some basic knowledge about the eye**. Essentially, the students will learn more about the **importance of good eye care**, in order to achieve **healthy vision and good learning outcome**.

Learn about the eye in greater detail such as the **importance of having two eyes, good hygiene, eye protection, impact safety and various optical corrections.** Students will also reinforce prior knowledge on eye structures, its functions & good visual habits from Part I.

Visual assessment



This assessment helps to detect potential visual issues that may affect learning outcome. Whilst these eye screenings do not replace a comprehensive eye examination, this is useful in alerting parents of issues that require early attention. A visual skills assessment allows us to screen the children for potential eye coordination issues that may affect their learning experience.
